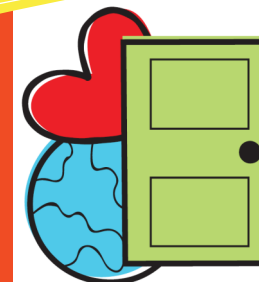

This time of year, many of our local school districts are gearing up for "annual review season". This means that if you have a child with an IEP, there is a good chance you will have a CSE meeting sometime in the next three months. The annual CSE meeting is not just about listening to your child's teacher and therapists talking about the year- it is a chance for you to share your vision and long-term goals for your child and to check in on their progress toward those goals. Are you ready to fully participate in your child's CSE meeting? If not, we're here to help!

In March and April, we are offering several trainings to help parents learn about the special education system:

On March 8, our education advocates will share tips for your next meeting in "Preparing for Your Child's CSE Meeting".

On March 24, Kara Georgi, Family Education Specialist from Starbridge, Inc., will talk about special education regulations in "Understanding the Special Education System".
