Introducing the Family Resource Network's Embark Program

More families are being asked by OPWDD to use Family Support Services before qualifying for the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) waiver. At Family Resource Network, we offer a variety of Family Support Services. Family Resource Network Embark is a group of services designed to support the families of young children with developmental disabilities. Our goal is to make caring for a child with a developmental disability easier by helping families build confidence and understanding, learn advocacy skills, and connect with other families to reduce isolation.

- Access to 1:1 support from one of our advocates to help you understand your child's disability, connect with resources and services, and navigate the special education system, OPWDD, mental health, and other systems for your child.
- An online support group for families of children under 8 with developmental disabilities. This will meet twice a month.
- Monthly trainings geared toward the needs and interests of families of young children with developmental disabilities.
