Teen Social Skills Program

Located at Our Lady of Sorrows, 801 Main Street, Vestal, NY 13850

Our Teens (a.k.a. Geckos) enjoy making a meal after school and everyone participates! They plan the menu, cook the dinner, set the table and clean up. This single activity is lots of fun and provides the teens with several opportunities to communicate and socialize with each other in a natural, relaxed atmosphere. After dinner, the group likes to form teams and play the X-Box or board games, participate in role play situations, sing, or exercise and talk about the day.

Our Social Skills Program accepts applications for teens diagnosed on the Autism Spectrum. Our goal is to create opportunities for teens to build age-appropriate social skills, interact with peers and form relationships.

There is no charge for teens who are eligible for services through OPWDD and who meet the criteria below.

Social Skills Program eligibility...teens must be:

13-19 years of age
Residents of Broome, Tioga, Delaware, Chenango, Otsego, or Tompkins counties
Enrolled in a regular education program during the school year
Non-injurious to self and others
Without aggression or violent behaviors
Without history or risk of flight
Live at home

Our Social Skills Program offers teens opportunities to:

Sharpen their communication skills Develop social appropriateness Mix and mingle with peers and adults Participate in interactive activities

Teens meet on the first and third Monday of each month, during the school year.

The Power of Communication:

Everyone has a Story to Share

For individuals with complex communication needs there is often a great deal of untapped potential that families and providers struggle to bring out.

This presentation will focus on utilizing assistive technology, primarily tools and strategies related to augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) from low tech to high tech, to support communication and language development for individuals with complex communication needs. The attendees will have the opportunity to participate in hands-on activities to further their knowledge and skills in the area of AAC, to support individuals at home, school and in the community.

About Our Speaker:

Tina N. Caswell, MS, CCC-SLP is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology at Ithaca College, teaching and supervising in the area of augmentative and alternative communication (AAC). Ms. Caswell's clinical experience encompasses private practice, early intervention, public schools, long term care, and university settings. 
